MODULE 6 — SHARING YOUR FAITH NATURALLY

Living and Speaking the Gospel with Confidence and Compassion

Module Overview

At some point in every believer's journey, faith becomes too meaningful to keep to ourselves.

The Gospel was never intended to stop with us.

It was always meant to move through us.

Jesus' final instructions to His followers were not simply to believe—but to go, make disciples, baptize, and teach others to obey everything He had commanded.

That mission continues today.

Throughout **THE SPARK**, you discovered the hope of salvation through Jesus Christ.

Throughout **THE EMBERS**, your faith matured through spiritual disciplines and growing obedience.

Throughout **THE IGNITION**, you've learned to walk with the Holy Spirit, study God's Word, discover your gifts, deepen your prayer life, and serve others with Christlike compassion.

Now those pieces come together.

People are naturally drawn to authentic faith.

They notice compassion.

They recognize integrity.

They appreciate genuine love.

Eventually, many will ask the question:

"Why are you different?"

Sharing your faith is simply responding to that question with humility, honesty, and love.

Evangelism is not about winning arguments.

It is about introducing people to Jesus.

John Wesley believed every Christian should become a witness—not because they possessed all the answers, but because they had personally experienced God's transforming grace. His movement spread rapidly because ordinary believers faithfully shared what Christ had done in their own lives.

You don't need a theology degree.

You don't need perfect words.

You don't need every answer.

You simply need a willing heart and a life that points people toward Jesus.

The Holy Spirit is already working in people's hearts.

Our role is to faithfully join Him in what He is already doing.

As you continue fueling the fire of your faith, you'll discover that some of your greatest opportunities to share Christ will come through ordinary conversations with ordinary people.

And God specializes in using ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things.

"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect."

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LESSON 21 — EVERY BELIEVER IS A WITNESS

Theme

Every Christian has a story worth sharing because every Christian has experienced God's grace.

Key Scriptures

- Matthew 28:18–20
 - Acts 1:8
 - Mark 5:18–20
 - 2 Corinthians 5:17–20
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Big Idea

God calls every believer to represent Christ wherever He has placed them.

Introduction

Many people believe evangelism is only for pastors, missionaries, or gifted speakers.

Jesus never taught that.

His Great Commission was given to every disciple.

Wherever God has placed you...

Your family...

Your workplace...

Your school...

Your neighborhood...

Your community...

He has also placed people who need to experience His love.

Sharing your faith isn't another task to complete.

It's a lifestyle.

People are often more interested in your story than your sermon.

Your life becomes living evidence that Jesus still changes people.

Living as a Witness

Being a witness means:

- Living with integrity.
- Loving people well.
- Serving without expecting recognition.
- Speaking about Jesus naturally.
- Trusting God with the results.

You are not responsible for changing hearts.

Only God can do that.

You are simply called to be faithful.

LESSON 22 — SHARING YOUR STORY

Theme

Your testimony is one of the most powerful ways to introduce someone to Jesus.

Key Scriptures

- John 9:1–25
- Acts 22:1–16
- Psalm 66:16
- Revelation 12:11

Big Idea

No one can argue with the story of what Jesus has done in your life.

Introduction

Every believer has a testimony.

Some stories are dramatic.

Others seem ordinary.

Both are powerful.

Your testimony isn't about how bad your life once was.

It's about how good God has been.

A simple testimony usually includes three parts:

Before Christ

What was your life like?

Meeting Christ

How did you come to faith?

Life with Christ

How is Jesus continuing to transform your life today?

Keep your story centered on Jesus.

People don't need to hear how impressive you are.

They need to hear how faithful God is.

Preparing Your Story

Write your testimony so it can be shared in:

- One minute.
- Three minutes.
- Ten minutes.

Practice telling it naturally.

Keep it authentic.

Keep it hopeful.

Always point people to Jesus.

 2. Which part of your story encourages you the most?
 3. How could your testimony encourage someone else?

Write your three-minute testimony.

Practice sharing it with a trusted Christian friend.

LESSON 23 — HAVING SPIRITUAL CONVERSATIONS

Theme

Sharing Jesus often begins with listening well.

Key Scriptures

- Colossians 4:2–6
 - Luke 24:13–35
 - James 1:19
 - Proverbs 15:1
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Big Idea

Great Gospel conversations begin with genuine relationships.

Introduction

Jesus rarely began conversations with lectures.

He asked questions.

He listened.

He showed compassion.

He met people where they were.

The same is true today.

People don't want projects.

They want authentic relationships.

When we genuinely care about people, opportunities to talk about faith naturally arise.

Instead of forcing conversations...

Ask questions.

Listen carefully.

Respect people's stories.

Share your own experiences honestly.

Trust the Holy Spirit to guide the conversation.

Building Meaningful Conversations

Helpful questions include:

- What gives you hope?
- Have you ever had a spiritual background?
- How can I pray for you?
- What do you think about Jesus?
- Can I share something that's helped me?

Kindness opens doors.

Listening builds trust.

Love creates opportunities.

Reflection

1. Are you a better speaker or listener?
 2. Who in your life is open to deeper conversations?
 3. How can listening become part of your witness?
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Weekly Challenge

Have one intentional spiritual conversation this week.

Focus more on listening than speaking.

Pray before and after the conversation.

Prayer

Holy Spirit,

Teach me to listen with compassion, speak with wisdom, and love people the way Jesus loves them.

LESSON 24 — INVITING PEOPLE TO THEIR NEXT STEP

Theme

Our role is not to pressure people—it is to lovingly invite them toward Jesus.

Key Scriptures

- John 1:35–46
 - Luke 15
 - Romans 10:13–15
 - Matthew 11:28–30
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Big Idea

God asks us to extend invitations while trusting Him with the outcome.

Introduction

Andrew didn't preach a sermon.

He simply brought his brother Peter to Jesus.

Philip simply told Nathanael,

"Come and see."

Many people are waiting for someone to extend an invitation.

An invitation to church.

An invitation to coffee.

An invitation to read the Bible together.

An invitation to pray.

An invitation to explore faith.

God changes lives.

We simply open the door.

The Holy Spirit prepares hearts long before we arrive.

Our responsibility is faithful obedience.

His responsibility is transformation.

Extending Invitations

Pray for opportunities to invite someone to:

- Attend church.
- Join a small group.
- Read Scripture together.
- Watch a sermon.
- Listen to a podcast.
- Serve alongside you.
- Explore **THE28th.LIFE**.

Simple invitations often become life-changing moments.

Reflection

1. Who could you invite to take one step closer to Jesus?
 2. What fears keep you from inviting others?
 3. How does trusting the Holy Spirit remove pressure from evangelism?
 4. What invitation could you extend this week?
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Weekly Challenge

Prayerfully invite one person to join you for church, a Bible study, a small group, or a conversation about faith.

Trust God with the results.
